Her favorite subjects were English because she liked to write and it came naturally. There was also Science because she like to know why things were they way they were. During her senior year of high school she married Joey Uhl and had a baby girl. Once she graduated she began working and they had two more children. However life happened and Sherry found herself single again. She remained a single mom for a little while before Tim Waters walked into her life at work. Eventually they got married on October 16, 2005 and had a baby girl, making a total of four children for Sherry.

He did and they both made a commitment to follow God all the days of their life. Relationship with God is now completely about being in love with Him and He being completely being in love with her.

It is her desire to see the people of Revolution Church whole-heartedly fall in love with Jesus. Not just love Him, but be in love with Him. Then they'll know who they are and then they can be who they were created to be.
